Local councils and councillors make a big difference to local people's lives. They need to be passionate, open-minded and team players, who are **champions for their communities**.

What is expected of a local councillor?

- · Represent their communities' views at council meetings
- Know their area and be aware of issues
- Communicate council decisions that affect the community
- Work with representatives of local organisations, interest groups and businesses

How much time does it take up?

This will vary from council to council. Councils usually meet once a month for the council meeting. Meetings can last from two to three hours, depending on the agenda. There may be actions to take away, and emails/calls to respond to during the week. Time will vary depending on the size of the village/town and how involved the councillor becomes.

You must be 18 years of age or older, and live or work in an area that is served by your local council.
